Giving young people more opportunities to express cultural diversity

- Speaking with leaders about the following key concerns:

- Deploying more schemes similar to EDI (**equality, diversity, inclusivity**) in schools and around the borough

-Decolonising the curriculum to resonate more with young people, eg. **"Colour In Literature"**

-Not just using cultural differences as a "tick box" for schools to be able to say they have celebrated cultural diversity

If elected as Youth Mayor, I vow to make voicing your concerns more accessible through social media and forums/surveys, I promise to listen to as many of your suggestions as possible and be a voice for not only those who are comfortable having their voices heard, but for those who feel like they don't have a voice, representing all young people to the council.
