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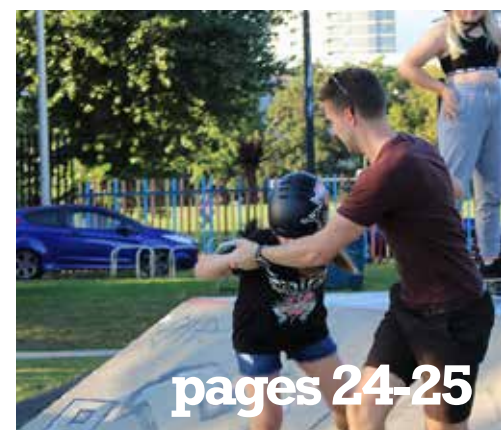

# Nominate a community champion

# Making sure people have a home

Wandsworth is to make a £1.18m investment in improving support for homeless people.

The council will create 23 new full-time jobs for staff focusing solely on preventing homelessness and supporting the homeless.

In addition, the sale of vacant properties will be suspended and £8m will be made available to buy larger replacement properties. A major review will report back in the autumn to look at whether the council is doing all it can with its own properties to ensure there are enough available homes.

Cabinet member for housing Cllr Aydin Dikerdem said: “This is the first in a raft

of measures we will bring in to ensure Wandsworth people and their families have secure, genuinely affordable homes.

“We will no longer tolerate our residents priced out of their own borough, preyed upon by unscrupulous landlords or, worst of all, with no home at all.

“We believe that there should be no homeless people in our community, and Wandsworth children should not wake up homeless in council temporary accommodation. I believe we are taking the vital first steps.”



## Making homes more energy efficient

Around 350 homes in 42 council blocks are to be made more energy efficient to help save people money.

The council has partnered with Warmfront to improve the homes' Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) banding by installing cavity wall installation. Warmfront surveyed all the council's 33,000 properties to identify the properties that are eligible for cavity wall installation, funded through the Government's ECO scheme.

Cllr Aydin Dikerdem, cabinet member for housing, said: “The cost of living crisis is being felt by families across Wandsworth, so it is crucial to make sure our council homes are warm and well insulated in order to protect people from high energy costs.

“Upgrading our homes through ‘retrofitting’ not only saves people on their bills, but also protects people's health and wellbeing from cold and damp, reduces fossil fuels use and creates skilled green jobs for the future.”

## Take care when charging

Following more than 70 fires in London last year involving e-scooters and e-bikes, Wandsworth Council is urging people to take care when charging their vehicle in their home.

Allow batteries to cool down, don't leave them charging when you are out or asleep, don't expose them to extremes of temperatures, try to prevent them becoming damaged, always use the correct charger and unplug it when you have finished.

# Citizens' Assembly to tackle air pollution

A Citizens' Assembly will bring the borough together in a bid to clean up the air.

In the autumn the council will convene the assembly made up of a representative group of local people. Senior councillors and officers will support the assembly to put together an action plan on how to tackle pollution hot spots.

The council will also step-up work to tackle climate change, such as decarbonising its vehicle fleet and buildings, including council homes. In September there will be a review of borough-wide emissions targets and a close look at the findings of a comprehensive climate risk assessment. These will feed into targeted support to residents, businesses and schools to reduce emissions.

“Getting to net zero is the mission of our generation and the next four years are crucial if we are to achieve this,” said the council’s environment cabinet member Cllr Judi Gasser.

“We heard from residents how important tackling climate change is to them. We will reflect this ambition in our borough-wide target as well as identifying areas in Wandsworth where the greatest impact of climate change will be felt so that we can target support. We can only tackle climate change by working together. That means listening to each other and finding a way to move forward.”

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# Supporting clean green travel

More school streets, bike hangars and electric vehicle charging points are on their way, Wandsworth Council's new transport chief has promised.

And Cllr Clare Fraser said encouraging cleaner sustainable transport will be a key part of council efforts to reduce air pollution and address the climate change emergency.

The roll-out of vehicle charging points will be expanded, and they will be equally spread out across all neighbourhoods, while the number of bike hangars available for people to store their cycles will be doubled – adding storage space in streets across Wandsworth for an additional thousand bikes.

And there will be more school streets, which ban cars from streets with a school entrance in during drop-off and pick-up time. Where school streets can't be put in, junctions will be made safer. “We will review all the council's major transport schemes over the next few months,” said Cllr Fraser. “We need to ensure they are delivering for Wandsworth and are moving at the pace local people expect.

“I will be working very closely with cabinet member for the environment Cllr Judi Gasser and senior council officers to ensure our transport policy is an integral part of our work to clean up some of the shockingly poor air in parts of our borough.”

# Living Wage pledge

All new contracts signed by the council must guarantee workers the Living Wage, Wandsworth has pledged.

Council leader Cllr Simon Hogg said: "Any company that tenders for a council contract will need to guarantee that their workforce is paid the Living Wage as a minimum. This includes people who do some of the borough's most difficult and challenging jobs, including those who clean our streets, collect our refuse and recycling and care for the sick and elderly in care homes.

"There is no moral justification for paying people less, especially at a time when household bills are going through the roof and families are struggling."

## Equality care

A pioneering pilot project will support work in Wandsworth Council to ensure workplace equality and transform social care.

Wandsworth is one of 18 councils nationwide adopting a social care Workplace Race Equality Standard. It will collect information about the experience and treatment of staff from black, Asian and minority ethnic backgrounds and other marginalised communities in order to support their professional development. It will also ensure that social care clients receive culturally appropriate care and support.



### Help shape play revamp

The council is seeking your views on how to spend £187,000 earmarked for the refurbishment of the Coronation Gardens play area in Southfields. An additional £30,000 will be spent on biodiversity improvements.

People who live near or who visit Coronation Gardens are being asked how they use this green space and how they think it could be improved.

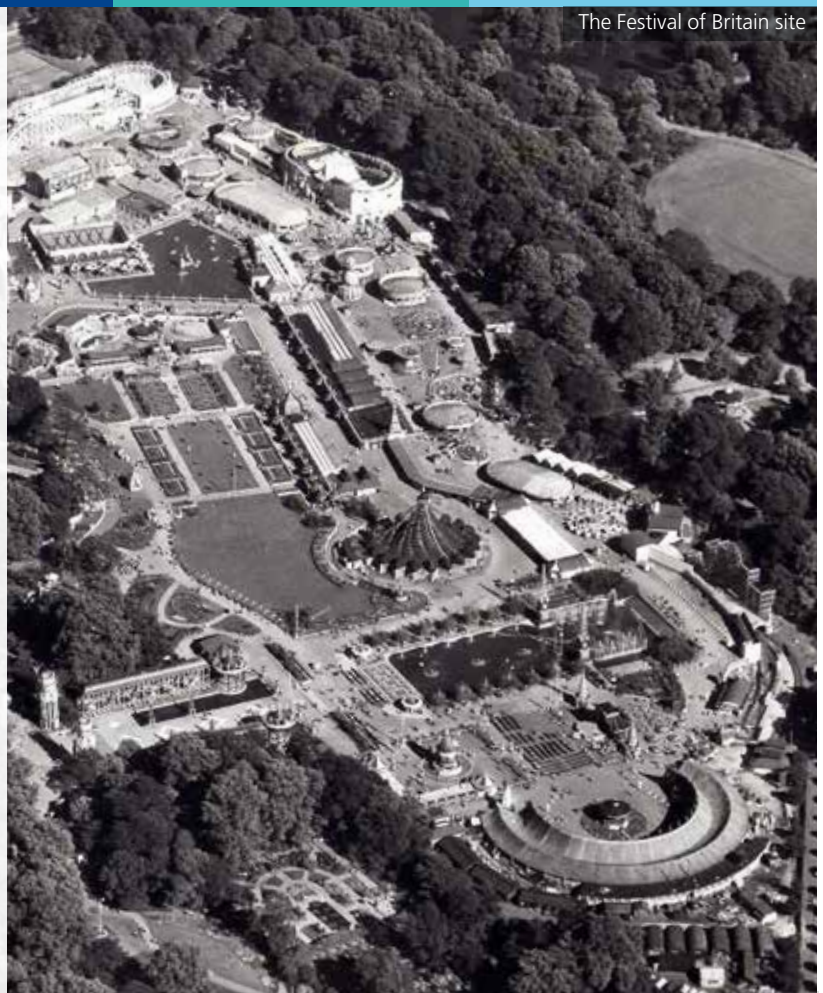

## Big Dipper memorial planned

A memorial is planned in Battersea Park to honour the memories of five young people who were killed in a fairground accident 50 years ago.

The Fun Fair in Battersea Park was established during the Festival of Britain in 1951. Tragedy struck on the afternoon of May 30, 1972 when the train on the Big Dipper roller coaster became detached and crashed.

The council is talking to the families and friends of the young people to come up with a fitting memorial. In the meantime the Mayor of Wandsworth and local MP Marsha de Cordova have planted a memorial tree near the park's peace pagoda.

# New Cost of Living Commission

Wandsworth has put together a package of support to help local people who are struggling financially.

A new Cost of Living Commission will meet in the autumn, bringing together independent experts who will go out into the community to speak to local people. They will bring what they find back to the council so that a set of actions can be drawn up.

Plans are also being drawn up for a Cost of Living Hub made up of different council departments and Citizens Advice Wandsworth. This will give residents a single point of contact to request help.

The voluntary sector is to be given an extra £100,000 via the Wandsworth Grant Fund to enable it to provide more support, and the council will focus on 'getting people out of debt rather than just getting debt out of people' by providing targeted support to residents falling behind with payments.

Gaps in the Government's Council Tax Energy Rebate Scheme will be plugged so that people who are not liable for council tax, or who live in ineligible property bands but are on means tested benefits, are able to get payments. Extra financial support will also be given to pensioners and care leavers.

"We have already committed to keeping council tax low, but this comprehensive package of actions shows that we want to do much, much more than that," said cabinet member for finance Cllr Angela Ireland (pictured right). "We will continue to work with our partners to ease the burden for local people."

# Pledge to support local businesses



The council's new business spokesperson made meeting local businesses one of her top priorities during her first month in office.

Councillor Kemi Akinola joined a Wandsworth Chamber of Commerce meeting and breakfast event to hear how the local business and charity communities are recovering after the pandemic, while dealing with challenges such as recruitment, supply chains and space requirements.

She said: "I'm committed to listening to local businesses and charities, hearing the issues they are facing and understanding how the council can support them.

"It was great to meet such a range of business owners and hear their passion for the borough. The business sector, working in partnership with the council, is key to the borough's recovery from the pandemic and overcoming new challenges. It's also important that we work together to improve access to work for young people, refugees and people who choose to make Wandsworth their home.

"Another top priority for me is ensuring the borough's community, charity and voluntary sector is much better supported, particularly at a time when its services are so needed. We're investing another £100,000 into the Wandsworth Grant Fund to help local organisations deliver support."

Beverley Corson, CEO of the Wandsworth Chamber of Commerce said: "We're looking forward to working together and providing support to achieve the council's objectives in Wandsworth."

## Voluntary sector to be strengthened

The council is commissioning an independent report on the borough's voluntary sector to see how it can be strengthened.

"It's time to have a real dialogue with our voluntary and community sector so that we can find out what local needs are, what gaps there are in provision and how we can make it work for everyone," said cabinet member for the voluntary sector, business engagement and culture Cllr Kemi Akinola.

Wandsworth has more than 900 voluntary and community organisations, many led and run by volunteers, including Age UK Wandsworth, Alzheimer's Society Wandsworth, Hestia, Katherine Low Settlement, Mushkil Aasaan, Regenerate RISE, The Furzedown Project, Wandsworth Asian Women's Association and Wandsworth Carers Centre.

# Wandsworth is safe sanctuary

Wandsworth is to become an official Borough of Sanctuary, providing a safe haven for people fleeing persecution.

Extra staff will work to make sure the borough is ready to provide as much support as possible for refugees.

In recent months, as well as providing homes for people from Afghanistan, Wandsworth has supported local people to sponsor around 850 people fleeing the war in Ukraine. Deputy council leader Cllr Kemi Akinola recently attended a Refugee Week reception hosted by the Wandsworth Refugee Champion, Deputy Mayor of Wandsworth Cllr Sarmila Varatharaj (pictured above). Cllr Akinola said: "Since the arrival of the Huguenots, Wandsworth has prided itself as a home for people fleeing wars and persecution. Wandsworth people are special and our communities are warm and welcoming.

"Now we want to put the structures in place to ensure the borough will always welcome refugees, who over the years have done so much to make the borough what it is today."

## Hundreds helped by EU project

Citizens Advice Wandsworth's EU Project has supported almost 500 people to apply for settled status since it was set up in partnership with Wandsworth Council in November 2017, and has hosted 146 information events.

The project helps Wandsworth residents who are EU citizens apply for settled and pre-settled status so they can secure their rights to continue living in the UK.

It is still possible to submit late applications to the EU Settlement Scheme and CAW will be offering support until at least September.

# All aboard the health bus

The council's health bus has been visiting locations across the borough with its community health champions and NHS staff, giving advice to stay healthy, manage your weight and stop smoking, as well as administering the COVID-19 vaccine.

Community health champions along with a pharmacist and NHS colleagues have been doing free blood pressure checks for residents' as well as offering advice to prevent conditions like diabetes, cancer and heart disease and answering questions about COVID and other vaccinations.

The bus has already visited locations in Tooting, Roehampton, the Henry Prince and Alton Estates, with many more visits over the coming weeks and months.

The public health team have mapped out a route for the bus covering many locations across the borough.

The outreach bus has been providing tips and advice on a range of health conditions,

- Tips to stay healthy and active, as well as managing your weight
- Blood pressure checks
- Help to stop smoking
- Preventing and reducing your risk for several diseases, including diabetes, cancer and heart disease
- Immunisations for you and your family
- Information about the COVID-19 vaccines, get the vaccine on the day
- Post-COVID-19.

# Help prevent 'self-neglect'

Self-neglect is when people are unable to look after their own basic needs – like hoarding, neglecting their own health or hygiene or not cleaning their home.

Wandsworth's Safeguarding Adults Board wants to raise awareness about this serious and complex issue, and is urging anyone concerned about themselves or someone else to get in touch.

Self-neglect could be caused by illness, age or poor mental health, and can be difficult to treat but not tackling it can lead to the problem getting much worse. The borough's adult social care, NHS, housing, mental health services, police and fire brigade work together to establish a relationship with the person and come up with solutions.

Julie's neighbour made a referral after noticing that Julie had lost weight, her appearance looked neglected and she had a lot of black bags piled up in the hallway of her flat.

The fire brigade installed smoke alarms, Julie's doctor did a full physical and mental health assessment and treated an underlying infection, and a care assessment was carried out, leading to Julie getting a visit from a carer once a day.

A housing officer supported Julie to declutter her flat and Age UK Wandsworth stepped in to take Julie out and reduce her isolation.

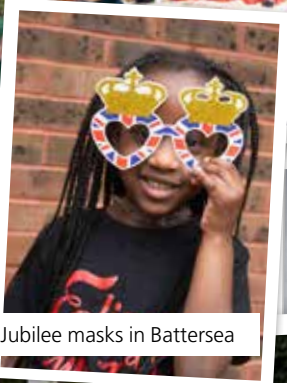

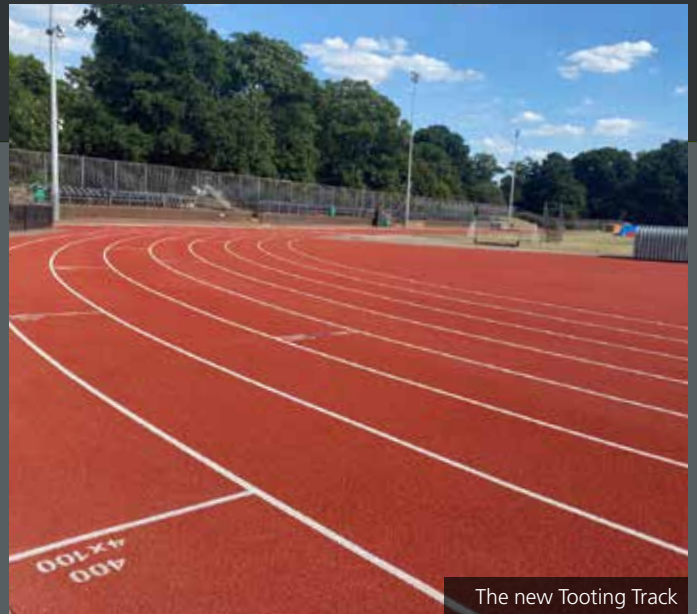
# Sport centre upgrades

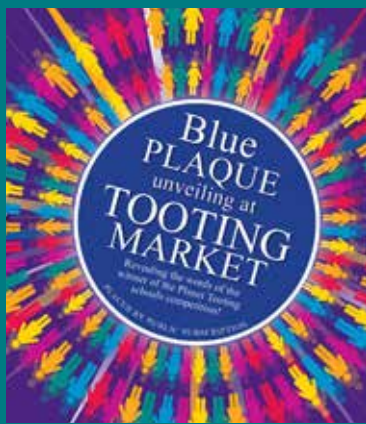
