Main Activities and Tasks:	Survey tree condition at specific historical sites on Tooting Common Answer enquires from members of the public Promote good Arboricultural practice
Where:	Tooting Common
Commitment:	1 day per month
Duration:	Minimum 6 months
Requirements:	Assist the Arboricultural Manager to prepare a suitable survey time table Attend training on basic tree survey techniques and methods (if required) Carry out tree assessments of areas in question in line with agreed time table Check in/out with Volunteer Coordinator on survey days. Must be able to walk a short, gentle survey route.
What's In It For You:	Working as part of the exciting Tooting Common Heritage Project, you will have the opportunity to contribute to the long-term health of the Common's important habitats and ecology. Training will be offered to cover all aspects of the role, such as tree identification and surveying tree condition.
