These workshops will cover gardening skills (summer planting, flower cuttings, growing kitchen herbs and more), health, family fitness classes, art, music and meditate. These will be carried out in conjunction with a range of local community partners and aim to bring in more people and hopefully encourage more people to volunteer in the longer term.
