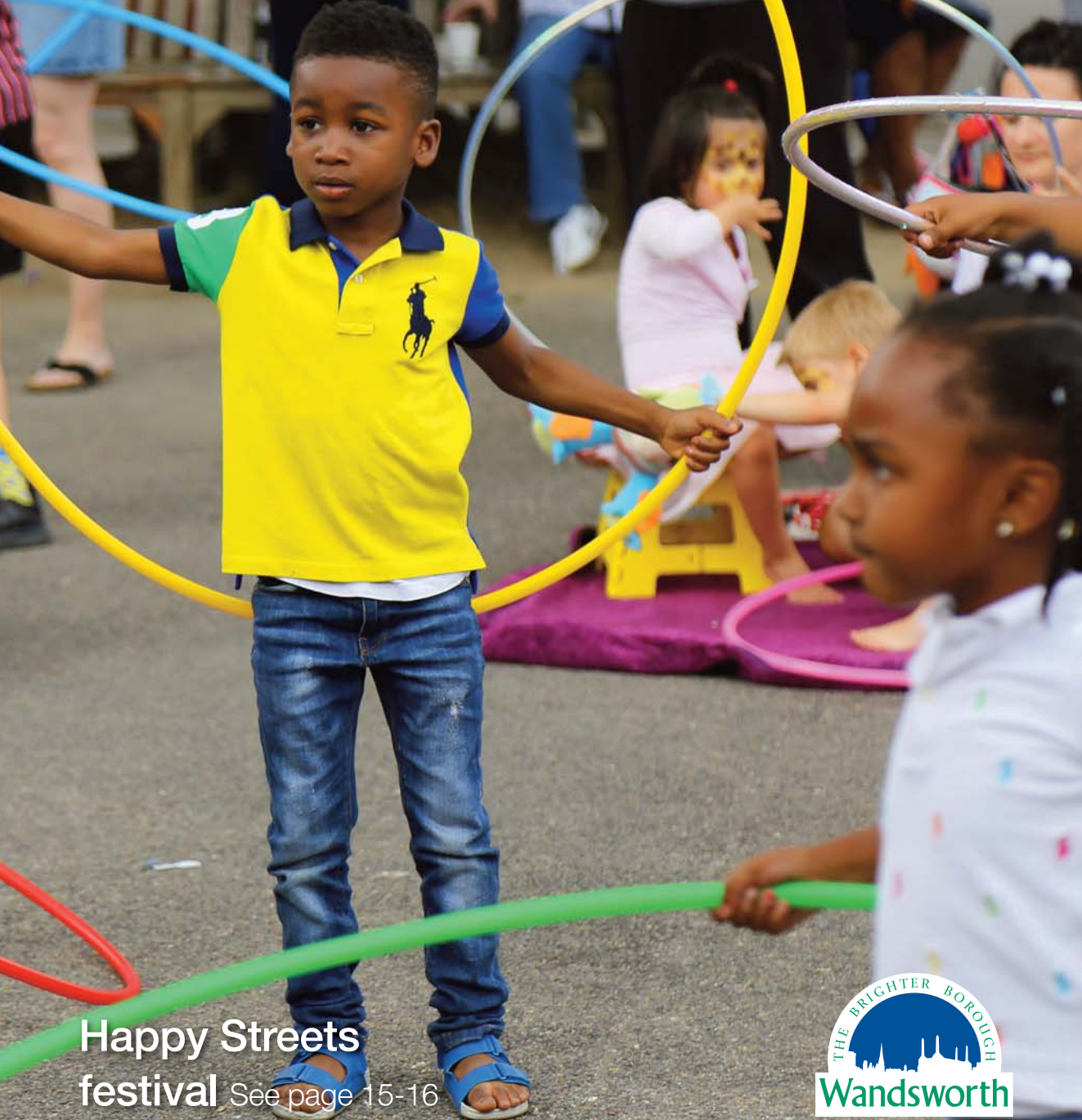

Better playgrounds

More playgrounds around the borough have been upgraded and new play equipment installed.



Work is complete on the children's playground next to St Mark's Church in Boutflower Road, Battersea (pictured left). Children under ten can now enjoy a redesigned play area with a range of new equipment including a large climbing frame, seesaw and musical play trail.



The playground at Chivalry Road has had a £165,000 revamp – with new landscaping and new safe play surfaces and modern new play equipment, including timber swings, slides, a seesaw, large climbing frame, benches and picnic tables.



The all-weather ball games area in Chivalry Road has also been refurbished with a new playing surface, fencing, renewed sports equipment and upgraded floodlighting so it can be used after dusk.

Falcon Park has a brand-new £2.1m all-weather sports pitch. The 3G artificial pitch aims to give the area's young people access to top-quality sports facilities and encourage them to get active. It will be used mainly for football but will also support other sports like rugby and cricket.



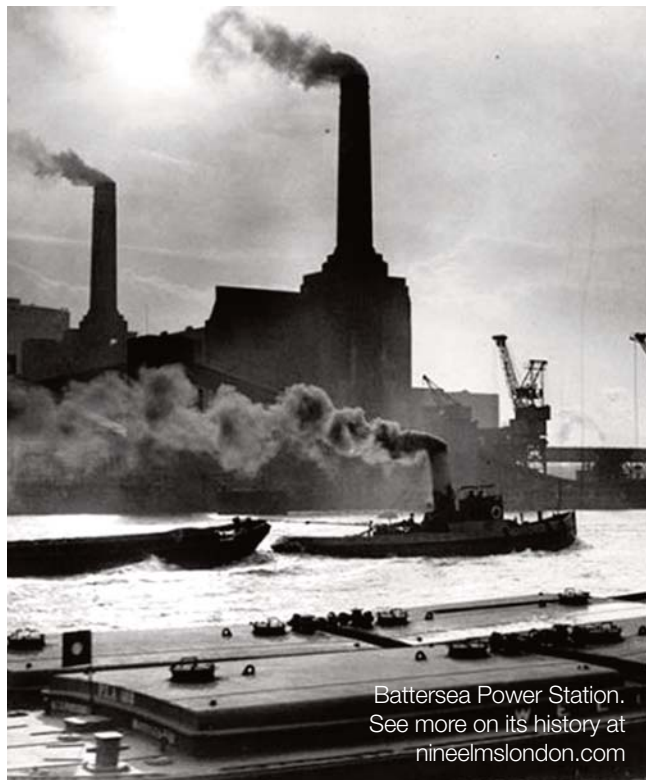


History winners

Projects on Battersea Power Station, the Daffodil King of Tooting and Dame Margaret Rutherford were all winners of the fifth annual Wandsworth/GLL Heritage Awards for Schools competition.

Pupils, parents, teachers and head teachers from each of the winning schools were invited to a town hall presentation, with prizes handed out by the Deputy Mayor of Wandsworth Cllr Sue McKinney.

First prize went to John Burns Primary School in Battersea who looked at the history of nearby Battersea Power Station. The research team won £750 for their school, plus medals each and a plaque.

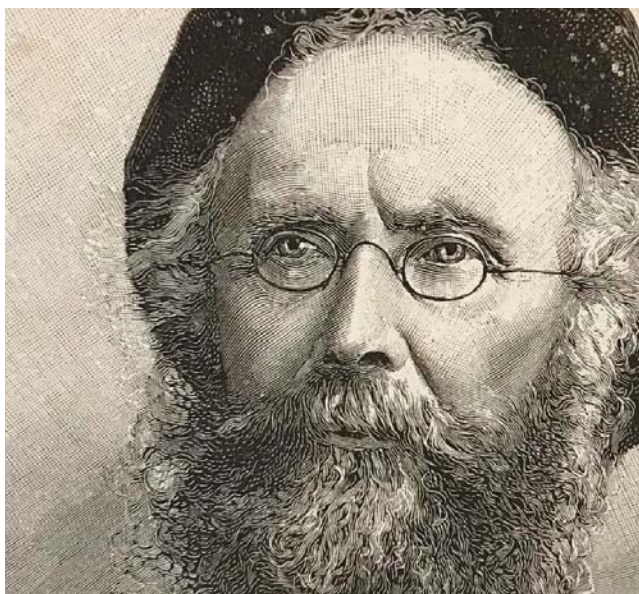

Broadwater Primary School was highly commended for research into Peter Barr, the 'Daffodil King'. The whole school worked on the project with the help of the Summerstown182 team. Peter Barr ran a nursery in the area in the 19th century and helped make the daffodil one of Britain's most popular flowers.

Granard Primary School in Putney was commended for its school-wide Local History Week.

The individual winner, who won £750 for her school, plus £100 in vouchers for herself, was Sabrina Oliveira from Broadwater School for her project on the actress Dame Margaret Rutherford, who was born in Balham. The awards were sponsored by GLL.

Farmers for the day

Pupils at Ronald Ross school ditched their textbooks and donned their wellies to become farmers for the day.

Eight-year-old Afeefa Haroon won this year's NFU Farmvention competition with an eco-friendly zip-line robot that protects soil structure by sowing, maintaining and picking the crop from above, removing the need for heavy machinery.

As part of her prize the school was turned into a farm for a day, and students enjoyed a day of flying drones, bug hotels, pizza and yogurt making, hatching chicks, potato harvesting and looking after sheep, goats and ponies.

Ronald Ross Headteacher Abby Brady said: "Farmvention has shown our pupils that there are amazing opportunities awaiting them in Britain's countryside. It has really helped broaden their horizons, especially as many of the children haven't even been outside of London."



Talking about speeding

Local school children have been helping the council and police educate drivers on the dangers of speeding.

The Junior Roadwatch scheme has been running since 2016, and sees Year 5 and 6 pupils using speed guns to encourage drivers to slow down outside schools. Now the scheme has evolved so that the children can also speak to drivers about the importance of road safety.

Up to ten children are taken to a location near the school chosen by the police. Any drivers found to

be speeding or ignoring traffic rules has a choice of enforcement action or having an educational road safety talk. If they choose the latter they will then be handed over to the children who in pairs will ask the driver questions about the offence and whether the experience has changed his or her view about road safety.

The first Junior Roadwatch event in this new format was held with

pupils at Ronald Ross School. Two drivers were stopped for ignoring a banned right turn and six for speeding. The children worked with police officers PS Liam Mallet, PC John Data, PC Andy Smith and PC Zack Taylor

Green fingers

Young gardeners at St John Bosco College have been recognised at the Celebrating Young People Awards.

Judges awarded them a Barbara Ward Award for Caring for Creation for their work creating a green oasis in the middle of Battersea at their weekly gardening club. They took a previously ignored patch of playground and turned it into a haven for plants and wildlife.

St John Bosco was recently graded as an outstanding Catholic school under Section 48 of the Education Act, by the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Southwark.

Wandsworth's green pledge

The Wandsworth Youth Council has pledged to 'youth proof' Wandsworth Council's new green pledge, and has promised to make sure young people have a say in how it is delivered.

One of the youth council's 2019-21 manifesto pledges is to raise awareness of climate change amongst young people. Meanwhile this summer Wandsworth Council set itself the target of becoming carbon neutral by 2030 and a zero-emission council by 2015.

The council and the youth council will work together closely over the coming months, but they have already made some progress including:

- An agreement by the council that it will install low-energy lightbulbs and recycling bins across its buildings.
- A promise that it will investigate the possibility of dual rubbish and recycling bins across the borough.
- Work on creating videos to be pushed out on social media to raise awareness of climate change.
- The chance for young people to go to high-level meetings of councillors and officers to put the youth voice across.
- 'Youth-proofing' the green pledge so that it is in a format and language that young people can understand.
- Helping to create factsheets for school about what schools and pupils can do to tackle climate change.
- Holding a 'takeover month' where young people will collaborate closely with council officers and help shape the council's work.

This includes creating educational videos on the impact of climate change and helping Wandsworth Council review its environmental policies.

Mental health support

Wandsworth has been chosen by the NHS as one of the Government's Trailblazer sites for the new Mental Health in Schools project.

Schools, health and social care professionals and local councils are working together to improve mental health through delivering training and support for children and young people, their families and teachers.

Teams are already working in a number of primary and secondary schools in Wandsworth, led by Southfields Academy, offering one-to-one support and group-work sessions for pupils and parents.

The project was awarded £1.85m of national 'Trailblazer' funding in December 2018 and an additional £4.3m in July this year to rollout further teams over the next two years, supporting more pupils.

In Wandsworth the additional funding will allow a team to be created working across further education colleges, and another team in Battersea working closely with the council's THRIVE Early Help service to focus on BAME young people who have suffered trauma.



Teachers are being trained in Mental Health First Aid and a course for parents called Empowering Parents Empowering Communities will also be introduced in the coming months. New online services for young people are also being put in place for pupils of secondary schools involved in the programme.

Wandsworth status as a Trailblazer site follows on from the success of the Wandsworth Youth Council's #YouthProof Mental Wellness project.

The project, which is funded by the Wandsworth Clinical Commissioning Group, works to improve young people's mental health, including recruiting and training 120 mental health champions.

Other examples of great involvement of young people in improving services include Youth Council members attending strategic planning days with NHS and council leaders, helping commissioners to design new services and its new young person friendly map of services. These achievements are up for a national Children and Young People award with the outcome announced in November.

Youth Games gold rush

Wandsworth's youngsters ran, kicked, netted, parried and hit the bullseye on their way to success at this year's London Youth Games - Europe's largest youth sports competition.



The Wandsworth Team won the London Youth Games Inner London Trophy, awarded to the inner London borough with the highest score across all disciplines, and came third overall out of 32 boroughs, claiming gold in male and female volleyball, archery and male Para-football.

They also took silver in male and female cross country, female squash and male table tennis and bronze in female Para-football, junior fencing and male and female hockey.

The events took place across a number of months and culminated in a finals weekend event at Crystal Palace National Sports Centre in July. Thousands of participants were involved in the competition and more than 500 athletes from Wandsworth were involved in this year's trials, training and competitions.

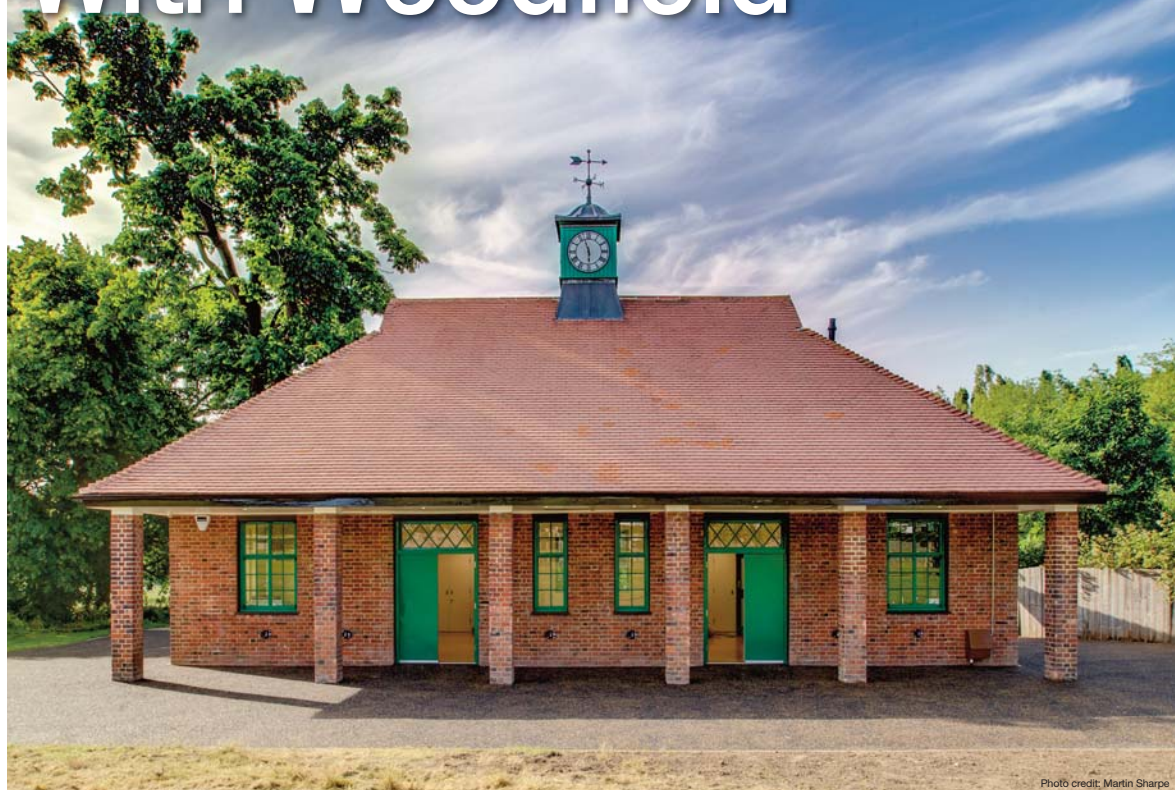
As part of the offer, the student must agree to practice his or her instrument for 20 minutes per day to gain the full benefits that learning a musical instrument brings.

Get involved with Woodfield



The Woodfield Pavilion has sat on the edge of Tooting Bec Common since 1933, but this summer it was reinvented as a multi-purpose community hub.

Woodfield has already partnered with schools to deliver outdoor education to more than 500 children. The independent charity is always on the hunt for new ideas and opportunities and is looking to collaborate with local residents, schools, businesses, and community groups to promote its core aims of health, learning, environment, art and recreation.

Since opening in June, Woodfield has run bug hunts, craft workshops, yoga, a pop-up cafe and hosted private parties. A burgeoning centre for arts in the area, they have hosted art classes, creative summer camps and two well-received exhibitions.

The building was refurbished with funds mainly from the National Lottery Heritage Fund as part of the Tooting Common Heritage Project. It includes a main hall, locker room, upstairs studio, and a kitchen and toilets (including all-ability access and baby-changing facilities). It is a unique site on the common and a great base for activities in all weathers.

Flu - get protected

Children in reception and years 1-5 will be offered protection against flu again this autumn.

Your school will contact you with details. It's also available free for two and three-year-olds and for older children with long-term health conditions – ask your GP for details.

The vaccine given to children is via a nasal spray – so you don't need to worry about needles. Flu can be a serious illness, and vaccinating against it protects children and stops them passing the virus on to other people.

The inoculation could cause a runny or blocked nose, a headache or general tiredness, but serious side effects are uncommon. The vaccine cannot cause flu.

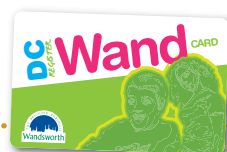
