#### Queenstown Green Management Plan

#### Queenstown Green is 'pocket park' popular with local residents for dog walking and exercise.

This plan is intended to provide Queenstown Green with its best chance to continue meeting the needs of the local community in addition to achieving the highest horticultural and environmental standards. Wandsworth has one of the highest numbers of council-owned greenspaces in inner London, culminating in over 300 hectares of public greenspace. Each greenspace has its own unique character, and each space provides the opportunity for a range of different activities for people and opportunities for biodiversity. The Green Flag Award scheme recognises and rewards well managed parks and greenspaces, setting the benchmark standard for the management of recreational outdoor spaces across the Unities Kingdom and the world. Wandsworth Borough Council wants each of the five big greenspaces to gain and keep their prestigious Green Flag Awards. Whilst Battersea Park, Wandsworth Park, King Georges Park, Wandsworth and Tooting Common have Green Flag status, the aim is, from 2032, each one of the borough's smaller greenspaces will be brought up to Green Flag level. This management plan for Queenstown Green sets out proposed plans for this park over the next 10 years.







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#### Key Action points

Park management and contractor activities - Subject to community input seek to improve permanent planting to provide year-round interest. Consider introduction of decorative beds.

Biodiversity activities - Improve existing planting areas increasing density, guantity and range of flowering plants to assist pollinators and other invertebrates.

Community engagement activities - Consider using this site as a key location to engage with dog owners to inform, work here and elsewhere.

Development and funding activities – Undertake engagement with users to identify priority requirements to the Green. Once priorities have been identified, seek funding to implement.







