
PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER

For the benefit of all users of public spaces, Wandsworth Council has made a Public Spaces Protection Order. This leaflet is a reminder of what is required and what is prohibited under the Order.



A new Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) is in force to protect people from anti-social behaviour in the borough of Wandsworth.





PUBLIC SPACES PROTECTION ORDER

Under the council's Public Spaces Protection Order:

You are **REQUIRED** to:

- Pick up your dog's mess and remove it from the area or put it into any bin, if provided.
- Keep dog(s) on a lead where required to, or, when required to by an authorised person
- Stop drinking alcohol when required to do so by an authorised person
- Surrender any opened or sealed containers of alcohol when required to do so by an authorised person
- Surrender intoxicating substances when required to do so by an authorised person

You are **PROHIBITED** from:

- Drinking alcohol and causing a nuisance
- Consuming, possessing, selling or supplying intoxicating substances
- Taking your dog into any area where dogs are prohibited
- Bringing more than 4 dogs into the area at any one time

Breach of a Public Spaces Protection Order is a criminal offence which may result in prosecution, conviction and a fine up to £1,000. Byelaws also apply to this public space.
