Christchurch Gardens Management Plan

Christchurch Gardens is a small popular historical park providing the local community with a tranquil space to enjoy and relax in nature

This plan is intended to provide Christchurch Gardens with its best chance to continue meeting the needs of the local community in addition to achieving the highest horticultural and environmental standards. Wandsworth has one of the highest numbers of council-owned greenspaces in inner London, culminating in over 300 hectares of public greenspace. Each greenspace has its own unique character, and each space provides the opportunity for a range of different activities for people and opportunities for biodiversity. The Green Flag Award scheme recognises and rewards well managed parks and greenspaces, setting the benchmark standard for the management of recreational outdoor spaces across the Unities Kingdom and the world. Wandsworth Borough Council wants each of the five big greenspaces to gain and keep their prestigious Green Flag Awards. Whilst Battersea Park, Wandsworth Park, King Georges Park, Wandsworth and Tooting Common have Green Flag status, the aim is, from 2032, each one of the borough's smaller greenspaces will be brought up to Green Flag level. This management plan for Christchurch Gardens sets out proposed plans for this park over the next 10 years.

Key Action points

Park management and contractor activities - Define and improve decorative beds and borders to offer all year-round structure and interest. Consult with WBC Conservation Officer over materials used in recent restoration of seating shelter.

Biodiversity activities - Define and improve wildflower meadow area and bulb areas to offer increased opportunities for wildlife.

Arboriculture activities - Manage epicormic growth at base of some trees and thin some trees to allow extra light into space.

Community engagement activities - Work with Friends of Christchurch Gardens to initiate, increase and support new and ongoing volunteering activities and events. Hold gardening days to raise awareness of volunteering opportunities.

Development and funding activities – Install water filling station, introduce interpretation board to include history, start feasibility regarding possibility of additional gate at Battersea Park Road boundary.

building. A memorial plaque on the shelter commemorates those Battersea residents who died in the Second World War. 8 brick columns support wooden arbores either side of the main building that have clematis growing Christchurch Gardens were originally laid out as an 'outdoors drawing room' in 1885 by the Battersea Vestry. The Battersea area had changed greatly in the nineteenth century,
starting as a small Surrey Thames-side village of market gardens, with a fairly rural aspect, and ending the century as a densely populated, industrial railway town with wharves and lightermen along the river front. Christchurch Gardens are adjacent to Christ and St Stephen Church and churchyard, built in 1849 to cater for the expanding needs of the growing Battersea village. These Gardens, to this day, provide a welcome calming space in the heart of busy bustling Battersea.
Outside the Gardens on Cabul Road is a Metropolitan Drinking Trough that was installed to quench the thirst of horses and cattle. This historical feature is no longer in use as a drinking trough however is now used as a planter.
Other public parks created during the same era in Wandsworth are Battersea Park (1858) and Vicarage Gardens, opened in 1895 as Battersea Wharf.
How to find Christchurch Gardens
By bus – The closest bus stop is opposite the Gardens entrance on Battersea Park Road, it takes less than 1 minute to walk from the bus stop to Christchurch Gardens.
By tube and train – the closest tube station is Clapham Junction Station, it takes 9 minutes to walk from the station to Christchurch Gardens.
By bicycle – the closest TFL bike docking station is on Simpson Street, it takes 2 minutes to walk to Christchurch Gardens.
By car -Christchurch Gardens has no dedicated car parking on site, although there is limited pay and display parking available nearby.





	Opening Times – Christchurch Gardens are not locked
Current main uses and users:	The Gardens are also regularly frequented by people using the picnic benches for lunch breaks and also with dog owners. The Gardens are also visited by people wishing to remember the Battersea residents who died in the Second World War.
Grassy Area:	The grassy area is used for picnics and lunchbreaks. A summer garden party was organised in partnership with Enable and Friends of Christchurch Gardens on this area. The mown grass is punctuated with swathes of snowdrops and daffodils in late winter and early spring. This area is also popular with dog walkers throughout the year.



Who is involved with looking after this place?	The Enable Parks team is a passionate group of people, who work together to maintain and improve Wandsworth Council's parks, commons, playgrounds, allotments and other greenspaces. Broadly split into three specialist teams: the trees team, the operations team and the parks development team, we work to deliver sustainable planting and urban greening, following both the borough's Biodiversity Strategy and Tree Policy. We are keen to recognise, value, manage and enhance the biodiversity and plant heritage of our landscapes - through these measures, we are contributing to a healthy planet and the wellbeing of our communities.
	Enable: look after all Wandsworth's public green spaces including Christchurch Gardens by ensuring the horticultural fabric, heritage, biodiversity and infrastructure of each site are maintained and improved.
	The Parks Operations Team look after over 32 public green spaces in Wandsworth. Each greenspace, including Christchurch Gardens, is managed according to the action plan within this document and in addition is checked regularly by Enable's Park Officers who report and act upon anything urgent in a timely manner. The Parks team work also collaboratively with Enable's other areas including Health and Wellbeing, Sports and Leisure, Bereavement, Events, Filming, Putney School of Art and Public Halls. Enable: look after all Wandsworth's public green spaces including Christchurch Gardens by ensuring they remain safe and welcoming places or everyone to visit.
Enable's Parks Operation Teams and Grounds Maintenance teams make regular visits to this place checking acting on any site infrastructure issues and anti – social behaviour. The Parks Team respond to enquiries to do with any aspect regarding over 50 public greenspaces in Wandsworth and can be reached by emailing <u>parks@enablelc.org</u> or calling the Enable Parks Office on 0203 959 0060. The Parks office is open 9am –5pm weekdays.
The Parks Enable Parks Team have partnered with:
Continental Landscapes who are contracted and instructed by Enable to undertake horticultural maintenance, a sports pitch booking service, maintenance of buildings furniture, fixtures and fittings, indoor building cleaning duties, litter picking, outside sweeping and clearance duties, ecological maintenance tasks, grounds maintenance and provision of sports facilities, hard surfaces, weed control, care of paths and surfaces, event preparation and staging. They oversee installation of temporary fencing where it may be required for health and safety reasons or when required to protect/recover certain areas from excessive footfall. They also install new planting and restoration schemes managed by the Parks Team.

Enable: looks after all and are responsible for the care and wellbeing of all trees in Wandsworth's public greenspaces including Christchurch Gardens. The Enable Tree team look after more than 60,000 trees in its parks, commons and public green spaces. Each Greenspace, including Christchurch Gardens, has a dedicated and experienced arboriculture officer who looks after the trees here and makes inspections on a three-year cycle which ensures that all trees are inspected regularly. The officer can assess a tree and identify whether works are of an urgent or non-urgent type. General tree health is considered as well as the condition and colour of the leaves, branches, upper crown and the trunk. Once all this information has been gathered a schedule of work is produced and any remedial works are actioned. Enable's Tree Team also runs an out-ofhour service for dealing with all dangerous or hazardous trees in addition to monitoring and managing any outbreaks of tree pests and diseases. Please help them by reporting problems, such as vandalism or damage to trees in Christchurch Gardens by emailing trees@enablelc.org or by calling the Enable Tree Team on 0203 959 0070. The Enable Tree Team have partnered with: KPS who carry out all tree maintenance works in Christchurch Gardens as instructed by Enable's Tree Team. Enable: look after Wandsworth's public greenspaces by supporting and working closely with local stakeholders, volunteers and 'Friends of' groups who share the same aims of providing and making improvements to high quality, well managed and inclusive greenspaces including Christchurch Gardens. The Enable Parks Team have partnered with: The Friends of Christchurch Gardens The Friends of Christchurch Gardens are a relatively young Friends group, established in 2019. While many of the original group members have since moved on from the group, there still remains interest from select individuals. The group is currently establishing a constitution, aims and objectives, and roles and





responsibilities for their committee. Their main interests include gardening and horticultural activities, improving the site for the local and wider community. Enable's Parks Team have partnered with: <u>The Parks Police</u> whose team routinely patrol these green spaces, enforcing byelaws and overseeing dog control, public spaces protection orders and policing events. The Parks
Police provide a service 365 days a year and officers are trained in legal and enforcement processes, conflict resolution, personal safety training and first aid. In total The Parks Police look after over 50 public green spaces in Wandsworth.
