

CALLING ALL RESIDENTS MOVING TO BLOCK 5!

The new building is the first to be built in the main area of the Winstanley and York Road Regeneration area. Designed to meet the re-housing needs of the residents of Scholey House, Kiloh Court, Jackson House and Arthur Newton House, the 126 new council homes will front York Gardens Park on a new Road, named Benfield Lane. The new road running from Wye Street to York Road, is named after an old street, which ran under the current York Gardens Park, before it was cleared after the War.

NASSAU HOUSE

Named for Jeanie Nassau Senior, the first female civil servant and the earliest advocate for the concept for fostering of children. She lived at Elm House on Lavender Hill, where Battersea Arts Centre is now.

SPARTALI COURT

For Marie Spartali, arguably the most famous pre-Raphaelite female painter who lived at Lavender Gardens.

MANNIN COURT

For Ethel Mannin, an Author of over 100 books and a political activist, who was born a Garfield Road in Battersea.

LANCHESTER MANSIONS

Edith Lanchester, an English socialist, feminist and suffragette and member of the Social Democratic Federation.

BRAUND MANSIONS

For Elizabeth Braund, 1921-2013 was founder of Providence House, Falcon Road, a purpose built Christian Youth and Community Centre.
