- Push for youth-led initiatives to be supported with funding and resources, which will allow young people to take charge of their ideas and turn them into impactful projects that benefit our community.

Too many of us struggle to access work experience, mentorship, and career guidance, leaving us unprepared for the future. Through my work with Work Match and financial literacy events, I have seen first-hand how impactful these opportunities can be.

Creating safe spaces that support young people needs.

Aims:

- Campaign for the creation of safe, inclusive areas where young people can meet, learn, and express themselves without judgment.
- Include young voices in conversations that shape our community.
- Promote policies that empower young people and don't restrict us.

I believe in a borough where young people don't just ask for change—we lead it. It's about stepping up, making our voices heard, and creating the future we deserve. Too often, young people are excluded from public places and decisions that affect us.
